• experience of being cared for by paramedics for any type of fracture that required pain relief

and/or

 had experience of being treated with morphine for any type of fracture that required pain relief

Background information

Hip fractures are a very common injury for elderly people. About one in three patients who break their hip will sadly die within one year and many patients may lose mobility and independence.

Pain relief before the patient reaches hospital can be inadequate and causes side effects which may slow down recovery.

The research project will be looking to test whether a local anaesthetic injection into the hip area called Fascia Iliaca Compartment Block (FICB) given by paramedics at the scene of injury is safe and effective.

What is required?

The study team are seeking 3 individuals in total:

• **1 person** to join their **trial steering committee (TSC)**. This role will provide trial oversight. The study team are looking for one individual to attend a day's meetings per year plus one day per year to read documents in preparation

• **2 people** to join their **data monitoring and ethics committee (DMEC)**. This role will provide trial oversight and ensure the trial is being conducted safely. The study team are looking for two individuals to attend a day's meetings per year plus one day per year to read documents in preparation

The trial is funded for 4 years.

What reward is offered for taking part?

Swansea University will:
