





Research Study Set-up

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Aim

- To provide an understanding of research study set-up and approval processes UK wide as they apply in NHS Wales.
- To inform you of forthcoming changes in UK processes and consider how they may impact on different stakeholders.
- In considering the processes, we will be specifically considering:
 - Non-commercial sponsorship of studies
 - Study-wide review by UK Nations
 - Study set-up at sites in participating NHS/ HSC organisations
- The outcomes of the workshop will be used to:
 - further develop the process flow for NHS Wales,
 - Identify the steps of the flow that may require revision, and
 - Inform the content of associated guidance documents.







Shared Local Information Pack (1)

- Builds on and extends the current collaboration between the NHS and Sponsors
- Concept of site specific <u>submissions</u> is removed
- Site set-up is a two way conversation
- Not submitted. "Shared" with NHS/ HSC organisation and "jointly agreed" within IRAS
- Shared with Principal Investigator (PI) and local research team AND R&D at the same time, so all know what is happening
- Sponsor chooses the time to share
- NHS organisations confirm agreement to take part in study







Shared Local Information Pack (2)

- Will replace the NHS SSI submission in Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales
- Will replace the Statement of Activities in England
- Used for commercial and non-commercial studies
- Will be the mechanism by which Sponsor (or delegate) shares and agrees project information with site
- Sharing will be in IRAS







Study wide reviewer perspective

Behaviour change


- IRAS Form submission will include site type master templates
- Sense check

Potential benefits

Aids clarity about what is happening in the study








Sponsor or delegate perspective (1)

Behaviour change

- Support study coordination staff to understand changes
- Early conversations with potential NHS/ HSC organisations to establish probable sites
- Be very clear what is happening at NHS/ HSC organisations, as well as funding and contract arrangements
- After the IRAS Form has been submitted, and as per study delivery plan, share complete Local Information Pack with R&D and local research team via IRAS
- Be available to have open conversations to agree arrangements for study delivery
- Expect NHS/ HSC organisations to confirm capacity and capability note for some studies this will be by provision of signed agreement







Sponsor or delegate perspective (2)

Behaviour change

- Set start date once NHS/ HSC organisation confirms capacity and capability (most site types)
- Update Sponsor SOPs to reflect new way of working especially around agreements

Potential benefits

- Consistent approach from all UK NHS/ HSC organisation R&D offices
- Sponsor controls when documents are shared (expectation that site selection conversations have previously occurred)
- Able to prepare documents for all sites at same time
- Manage site confirmation of capacity and capability within IRAS
- Able to see which sites have confirmed







NHS/ HSC organisation R&D office perspective (1)

Behaviour change

- Prepare to align processes to be nationally consistent
- Plan SOP update to include changes to local processes for managing Sponsor to Site agreements
- Prepare for dialogue rather than receiving a submission
- Collaboratively work with Sponsors to agree arrangements
- Receive shared Local Information Pack via IRAS
- Actively facilitate site set-up rather than check documents
- Ensure Principal Investigators/ study teams have an IRAS account
- Ensure R&D office has an official IRAS account to receive Local Information Packs and confirm capacity and capability
- "Confirm capacity and capability" to deliver the study instead of grant "NHS/ HSC Permission"







NHS/ HSC organisation R&D office perspective (2)

Potential benefits

- Consistent process across UK sites means less confusion across borders
- Sponsor and NHS/ HSC organisation conversation ensures collaborative set up and delivery
- Aids clarity about what is happening in a study
- Transparency between Sponsor, R&D office and Principal Investigator
- Clear time point when Local Information Pack is shared







Principal Investigator/ local study team perspective

Behaviour change

- Prepare to work to new processes to be nationally consistent
- Note and be trained in updates to organisation SOPs
- Prepare for early dialogue in collaboration with R&D office
- Have an IRAS account

Potential Benefits

- Consistent process for UK sites means less confusion across borders
- Principal Investigator is clear what is going on at all times
- R&D office receives information at same time so can provide set up support
