## Introductory summary

Following remit and eligibility checks, a policy prioritisation process and external peer and public review, the Funding Board considered **seventeen** applications. A summary of the funding recommendations can be found below.

**Eight** applications were initially recommended for funding, all of which were subsequently approved for funding by Health and Care Research Wales, with a total lifetime value of **£2,073,881**.

**Three** of the successful applicants were Early Career Researchers (ECR). All successful applications addressed the priority areas. Applications that addressed priority areas have a '(P)' in their reference. The priority areas were:

- Children who are looked after, and reducing the need for children to be in care
- Research topics identified through our prioritisation project: How can we best provide sustainable care and support to help older people live happier and more fulfilling lives?
  - Equality, diversity and inclusion.

In line with the Health and Care Research Wales' Conflicts of Interest policy, individuals with conflicts left the meeting during discussions of the relevant application and did not score those applications.
