


One Site Wales

One Site Wales is a research delivery model where multiple locations or Health Boards all contribute to a study as one national delivery team, with one shared recruitment target.

One Wales Study Delivery

One Wales Delivery models provide the sponsor with a single point of contact for sites in Wales.

Use of the One Site Wales approach improves the equity of access to trials for the Welsh population.

The introduction of an all-Wales recruitment target provides sites with flexibility in the delivery of studies.

The One Wales approach encourages collaborative working to overcome challenges, with a focus on shared learning particularly relevant to the care pathways in Wales.
