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


PANORAMIC



A national community-based Network

- Remote recruitment of 1,756 participants in 52 days by a team of 25 people working across Wales
- Collaborative working between Health and Care Research Wales, Cardiff University, Public Health Wales and the Welsh Blood Service to successfully recruit into the study
- Centrally texting patients with a COVID positive test result was key to publicising the study
- Allowed anyone in Wales to participate in the study regardless of where they lived or whether their GP practice is research active





ComFluCov



A Regional community-based Network

- One Visit Two Vaccines
- Recruited 128 participants in six days
- Study delivered in a One Site Wales model:
 - Public Health Wales were the lead site,
 - All recruitment was undertaken in Cardiff & Vale UHB
- Captured existing footfall to recruit a large number of participants in a short timeframe.





Primary Care and Community Research Delivery Centre (PCCR)



1. 'Team Wales'

- a. Increase Capacity
- b. Generalist primary care workforce to support in-hospital specialty managed research
- c. Parashoot Generalists into secondary care units to provide: In-hospital medic and research nurse support.
- d. Using the strengths of Community care to deliver at-home/near-home study visits



2. "One Wales"

- a. Decentralised remote and close-to-home delivery approaches on a regional/national level
- Utilising existing infrastructure and new enablers for delivery (e.g. mobile units, mass vaccination centre, outpatient centres) and opening the possibility of Mobile research visits to the patient's home
- c. Deliver effective research which is convenient and inclusive to all participants, across Wales



3. <u>"Expansion Wales"</u>

- a. Expanding capacity of our existing commercially-active GP practises
- b. Expanding existing hub-and-spoke capacity and networking clusters, c. 200,000 people in regions



PCCR Strategy 1: Team Wales

PCCR: A Wales-wide Approach



Engage, recruit and motivate the primary care workforce to optimise working and deliver clinical research in communities



Use our experiences of delivering research in patients' own home remotely (PANORAMIC), and locally through integration of primary care research teams into existing infrastructure (COMFLUCOV)



We will prepare an agile workforce, growing their confidence and capability to lead commercial research, to maximise the opportunities for the people in Wales to participate in research.
